MEMORANDUM FOR GENERAL STEAKLEY

Sir:

On 30 November I wrote a memo to Dr. Flax advising him of our telephone conversation concerning submission of the monthly forecast. I attached, for his approval, the proposed method of handling future JRC inputs which you and I had discussed in your office in early November.

Subsequently, Dr. Flax discussed the matter with Mr. Vance. Mr. Vance either could not recall discussing a change to the existing procedure with you or had changed his mind. He also was unable to confirm any cross-talk between himself and Peter Jessup which warranted a change. In any event, Mr. Vance stated unequivocally that "we would continue present procedures." Under these conditions, will you either reaffirm your understanding of Mr. Vance's desires or continue to submit a JRC input for the schedule of forecast activities as usual.

I will be on leave next week-returning to the office on 27 December. If you wish to discuss in the interim, Colonel Worthman is aware of details.
