Dear Dave:

The Space Technology Laboratories, Inc., has completed a study of the use of 65-1 launchers for 117L launches. The results of the study, undertaken at my request, are attached for your information and I would appreciate your views and comments on them.

The STL analysis, which has been verified by my engineers, concludes that:

- a. The technical feasibility of modifying 65-1 launchers for 117L use at a nominal cost is established.
- b. Range safety for southerly launches to an 83° retrograde orbit is not a serious problem.
- c. Southerly launches permit the full range of reconnaissance coverage desired.
- d. A decision one year prior to the first desired launch date would permit the establishment of a launch capability for WS 117L use.
- e. Stand conversion scope and time would not seriously degrade the ICBM-IOC.
- f. Atlas missile conversion and MOD II guidance support present no great problems.
