MEMORANDUM FOR MR. PACKARD MR. HELMS DR. DUBRIDGE

SUBJECT: Preparation for ExCom Meeting of November 25, 1969

The NRO has forwarded to you the regular financial report and issue sheets for the November 25 meeting.

To aid the ExCom in making decisions on the program priorities and to establish overall funding levels, I believe that this more detailed report will be useful. Similar reports will be submitted in the future as necessary.

Since the August 15 ExCom meeting, several severe budget restrictions have been imposed within the Department of Defense generally, notably in connection with the 703 exercise. I do not believe that the NRP, important as it is, can or should escape the serious scrutiny which all defense-related programs are now receiving. The subject/issue papers which you have already received are drawn up in such a way that the ExCom can readily establish a program at any of the levels \$1.1B, \$996M and \$944M.

To improve the ability of the NRO to carry a tits job of developing and managing systems which will fulfill the interligence needs of the government with the rea of assigned responsibile we have established an Analysis Group within the staff of our Office of Space Systems. This group will anduct analyses of proposed new systems, the relative efficiency of on any systems in fulfilling required commitments, and will make recommendations with respect to programming. Its work will be augmented by ad hoc efforts or studies using outside consultants.
