My notes on our meetings of 1 September and 10 September cover several points bearing on CORONA contracting, as outlined bales. I have no CIA memoranda relating to these meetings.

Mr. McCone made a long statement of his position that the 12 MRC was not properly organized, citing his Achorana. on which subject to Mr. McGeorge Lundy and to Mr. McMerrars. He which sained that it is wrong to permit one agency to influence the internal management of another and that therefore the (2) MRC acked that no further change be introduced into the COMMA comtract structure until this major issue is settled. (Something of a non-sequitur, in my view)

As I remember it, you spoke immediately upon his conclusion, any ig "All right, John, we think it is wrong, but if you want is that way we can run it that way." I supported this latter sincement, however recounting all the good management reasons that was wrong to operate in this way. I closed with a plac officer on General Greer's staff. Mr. McSone sgreed.

At the close of the meeting, I asked again whether we could have the CIN contracts administered from the West Coast, under General Grear. Mr. McCone spale agreed and said we "could have all the people we needed - engineers too." It was tacitly my view that the CIA contracts under discussion were those with ITEK, Eastman, Fairchild, and General Electric, as well as the Lockheod contract for fabrication of the psyload compartment. I have tried - always - and I believe I did so on 11 August - to make a package out of (i) installing

ST/TD, (11) establishing a LESS <u>systems</u> integratica General Grear, (11) adding clauses to all other

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Mr. McCone said that he had decided to arsign a new CIA man, Crowley, to Greer's staff to be responsible for all CIA activities on COLORA: contracting, security, and technical. He would have CIA contracting and security people with him. Crowley was identified as an engineer formerly with C.B./A.

In our presence, Mr. McCona directed General Carter to send we a monorchicum to this effect. It was agreed that we would form a technical advisory committees to Greer, with CIA representation, replacing the defunct COB.

You then directed we to report back on the (S) MAO actions taken to accomposate to this new arrangement. So far, I have seen no CLA correspondence of actions on the matter, and correspositingly have taken no setuce rysolf.
