Dr. McMillan, who at that moment was in a meeting with Lt General Carter and Dr. Wheelon, stated that he had seen a copy of the memorandum of record. I then related to him the action I had taken and the information Mr. Lundahl had given me, and recommended that he discuss the matter with Dr. Wheelon and request that all copies of the memorandum be withdrawn.

On 8 November Dr. McMillan told me that he had objected to the subject memorandum to Lt General Carter and Dr. Wheelon and requested that it be withdrawn.
