Satellite Systems Program

1. Communications Satellite Operational Research & Development Plan: (SECRET)

BMD Project Office released preliminary copies of the Operational Research and Development Plan for the Strategic Communications Satellite on 2 September 1959 to IBLF through IBMJ for review and comments. The plan defines the operational phase and necessary logistic support requirements. The complete communication satellite programming effort is being expedited to meet an early deadline presentation date in UBAF of mid September 1959. IBLF, jointly with Space Systems (IBMS), the buying office for Communications Satellites, will conduct the review and determine detailed logistic support requirements. IBMJS will only effect coordination action to establish the ACEMA (IMSD 2nd Stage) requirements.

2. SAMOS/MIDAS R&D Logistic Requirements: (UMCL)

Contractual action was effected in the SANOS and MIDAS contract to provide full compliance with the following logistic documents:

WBT Exhibit 57-7, "Hardware Analysis Progrem for Advanced Space Systems", revised 1 June 1959

WDT Exhibit 59-29, "Test GSE and Related Spares Selection Management"

IMSD Bocument No. 427102 "Reliability Requirements for SAMOS and MIRAS Programs", dated 20 March 1959. This document will provide the Air Force with the failure and consumption data previously required under the provisions of WDF Exhibit 57-3.

3. Acceptance of Discoverer Flight Test Vehicle No. 1055: (SECRET)


The thirteenth Discoverer Flight Test Vehicle, No. 1855, was accepted by the Air Force Acceptance Tesm on 27 August 1959. Since this vehicle is not scheduled for Launch from Vandemberg AFB until approximately Movember, the Tesm directed its return to Sunnyvale for correction of minor deficiencies noted.


4. Definitization of Satellite Systems Letter Contracts: (UNCL)

Megotiations for definitization of letter contracts AF-306 and AF-347 were originally scheduled for August. The proposals upon which such



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negotiation was intended were written in May. In the interim, several reprogramming actions took place which drastically affect the contractor's proposals, and now becomes necessary for the contractor to completely re-cost these programs. A new schedule has been arranged for definitization, based on re-submission of the contractor's proposals. This new schedule calls for work statement discussions during the month of September and beginning of October. Cost proposals will be submitted by the end of October, and price negotiations will take place during the month of December.
