MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR, NATIONAL RECONNAISSANCE OFFICE

SUBJECT: Project DORIAN Access - Colonel Donald H. Humphreys and Mr. Dwayne Anderson

- 1. For some time I have been attempting to arrange Project Dorian access for the above two individuals, without success. The Director, DIA has informed me that personnel associated with the Program Director have informed him there is no current need for DoD arms control personnel to be briefed, since there are no current programs concerning Project Dorian which involve arms control matters.
- 2. This view does not square with the facts as known to me. General Fred Dean has informed me that Project Dorian does have application to the arms control and disarmament field and that it may be used as an alternative to on-site inspection. While Project Dorian apparently was not approved primarily based on this role, its application in this field should not be disregarded. The high resolution expected and the capability for target differentiation would seem to make this a valuable means of acquiring intelligence. General Dean has also informed me that he must be able to discuss matters concerning Project Dorian with his OSD counterparts.
 - 3. Since a valid "need-to-know" apparently exists for five persons at the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, it certainly does not seem unreasonable to have my two action officers also cleared. I would appreciate your assistance in resolving this matter.
