SUBJECT:

CIA Program B Participation in CORONA

- 1. At the 1 September EXCOM meeting we agreed that CIA would furnish on the West Coast whatever resources are required to adequately support the traditional CIA role in CORONA. This memorandum sets down the specific terms of reference for this participation, in order that such a team can be expeditiously created without any misunderstanding of its mission.
- around a senior CIA man who would be posted to Los Angeles and physically located with the same. He would provide the gram B, with a single point-of-contact, close at hand, for all aspects of the program assigned to CIA. Specifically, he would be responsible for:

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  - a) The payload contracts (Lockheed, ITEK, and GE via the CIA contracting officer who would be located with him in the located

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- b) The security of the payload through the local security man.
- c) Two (or more if necessary) CIA technical people who would be assigned to him to work in CORONA.
- d) The assembly, installation, and checkout facility (SKUNKWORKS) at Palo Alto

where the payloads are assembled and tested.

This senior man and his team would be responsive to

but would retain ther lines of command, funding,

communications, etc., back to Program B in the Agency. The senior man could be made available now and his team within two months.

- 3. We propose to support the West Coast CORONA team with the technical in-house assets of CIA/DDS&T. In addition, M William we have the depth of covert support, contracting and security, available in Headquarters, to backstop the team in Los Angeles to whom the CORON responsibilities would be delegated.
- 4. In order to amke this arrangment a truly working one, it is our view that the CIA team should be a participating part of the program, in every sense of the word. Based on experience, it is our view that such participation should include,

-CAFT

but not be limited to:

- a) Participation incontractor-supplier meetings, across the system interfaces, such that the team responsible for payload development remain fully cognizant of total system status.
- b) Recognition by the of CIA's role in the payload area.
- the Configuration Control Board for seme similar coordinating mechanism) and affirmation of the CIA role in this body as the cognizant agency representing the payload.

5. It is my considered judgement that implementation of the agreement to furnish CIA support in California, which takes proper account of the responsibilities and terms of reference outlined here, would have significant benefit to the program.

You can be assured of me our enthusiastic support of such an arrangement.
