SUBJECT: Monthly Activity Report - April 1969

- 1. The following Activity Report is a summation of major events in the CORONA Program which occurred during the month of April 1969.
- 2. CR-7 System completed resolution, re-HIVOS testing, and special DSR testing. The new linear cams and slit leaves have been installed. The resolution tests showed satisfactory results. Results of re-HIVOS testing are as follows:
 - Corona marking some light corona marking was observed but was considered acceptable for flight.
 - The PMU was found to have the incorrect size nozzle this was replaced.
 - The DISIC unit demonstrated acceptable performance. C.


Special DSR testing revealed a temperature vacuum problem. The heat dissipation by convection is a semi-vacuum was at such a level as to effect circuit parameters after a substantial "ON" time. This "ON" time is being investigated to determine any possible effect on the operation of the command system during a mission.


CR-8 UTB modification continued on CR-8. The supply servo was installed and satisfactorily tested. The DDSC circuit modification was completed. This simplified the DDSC design - increasing its reliability.
