## CONTRACTING OFFICER'S DETERMINATIONS AND FINDINGS

## ADTHORITY TO REGOTIATE CONTRACT

The Central Intelligence Agency proposes to enter into a contract with the Ballistic Missiles Division, Lockheed Aircraft Corporation of Sunnyvale, California for the design and construction of a special reconnaissance system.

I hereby find that this procurement, Project COROMA, is estimated to cost \$6,951,000 and is chargeable to Fiscal Year 1958 funds and is for experimental, development and research work. I also find that this procurement is in the interest of Mational Defense and that it will be certified by the Director of Central Intelligence in accordance with procedure approved by the DCI on 15 December 1956, to be for objects of a confidential, extraordinary and emergency nature and therefore within the purview of procurement authority of the Agency as stated in Section 10(b) of Public Law 110, 81st Congress. Procurement by formal advertising of the services called for by the proposed Contract

would result in public disclosure of the nature and character of such supplies and services, and would thereby jeopardize the security classification of this project.

I hereby determine, as Contracting Officer for this contract, that the necessity and authority for negotiation of this contract have been adequately documented by proper Agency authority, and that the proposed contract must necessarily be negotiated without formal advertising.
