SUBJECT: Operations in the LANYARD Program

REFERENCE: Memorandum for the Record by Lt. Col. [redacted] subject: Current State of Project LANYARD; dated 18 April 1962 [redacted]

1. I have just read the report submitted by Lt. Colonel [redacted] on the meeting held on 13 April 1962 between CIA and the Director of [redacted] regarding certain areas of interest in the LANYARD program.

2. Throughout the report there is evidence that [redacted] regards the LANYARD program as one in which the Central Intelligence Agency has a supporting rather than a joint role. His desire to circumvent the terms of the original agreement in regards to the distribution of concurrent copies of LANYARD project communications between the three parties is an example of a trend that may extend into the operational area.

3. It is my understanding that there was some discussion on [redacted] proposal to do the E-4 camera system operation on the West Coast. This trend alarms me for the following reasons:

a. Under Operations, in the agreement, the Agency is charged with planning, direction, and control of the camera program as it now exists under the CORONA program. In fact this is the method of operation in all DPD programs; plan, direct,

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and control from Washington. In the next sentence of the LANYARD agreement it is possible to see this concept being eroded away. Quote, "These activities will include participation in all phases by personnel of the Director of [REDACTED] and the Director, Office of [REDACTED]" Exactly how this sentence is interpreted by the three parties to the agreement can well determine how the Agency is to meet its agreed responsibilities.

b. This inroad into LANYARD operations could have far reaching effects in present and future programs now under CIA control and in which the USAF has management interests.

4. It is not clear to me if new agreements will have to be written for each modification accepted in the LANYARD agreement as amended by [REDACTED] or if renegotiations will be required. The movement of the Contracting Office, Operations Center, and assignment of Lt. Colonel Murphy as liaison officer responsible only to [REDACTED] along with the control of Agency communications facilities will effectively remove CIA/DPD from operational control of satellite overhead reconnaissance as it pertains to future programs. It then remains to be seen if such control becomes retroactive and includes CORONA.
