AFSC has asked us to hold their hand to obtain an advance foreign clearance for the recovery aircraft and to give approval in advance (waive AFSCM 60-1) for the recovery aircraft to deploy to foreign bases in an emergency (see 23 April 1968 letter).

The probability of needing to deploy the recovery aircraft is remote, but I believe that it is only prudent to clear away the possible road blocks ahead of time. Therefore, recommend that we tell AFSC to go ahead and make the advance arrangements by sending them this answer.
