(U/ <del>/FOUO)</del> On 24 January 2020, the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) Office of Inspector General (OIG) received information from an NRO Contracting Officer (CO) in the Systems Engineering Directorate (SED) on the results of an investigation conducted by regarding its employee. advised the CO that it conducted an analysis to determine if improperly recorded hours he did not work as claimed on SED's contract otherwise known as As reported by actions potentially violated 18 U.S.C. § 287, False, Fictitious, and Fraudulent Claims, which makes it unlawful for anyone to make any claim upon or against the United States, or any department or agency thereof, knowing such claim to be false, fictitious, or fraudulent. 3. (U//FOUO) reported to the NRO SED CO that admitted to mischarging hours starting in October 2019. After reviewing timesheets, login/logout data, and badge records, determined mischarged labor hours to the contract during the months of October, November and December of 2019. did not provide a finding of how many hours mischarged; however, reported its intent to reimburse the contract for all 320 hours invoiced for in October and November, which totaled also reported that it did not invoice any hours for in December.
