This is in response to your request dated 4 December 2019 and received in the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) on 2 January 2020. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), you requested,

"All records and files containing any information about myself pertaining to satellite surveillance, satellite harassment, radio frequency harassment, remote neural monitoring, transcranial focused ultrasound, transcranial magnetic stimulation, weaponized infrasound, microwave auditory effect, radio hypnotic intracerebral control, electronic dissolution of memory, radio frequency ID implants or any other U.S. government issued implants, and organized gang stalking; taking place between the years 2007 thru 2019.
