1. TO PROVIDE YOU WITH A BASIS FOR RESPONDING TO REFERENCE AND TO MAKE OUR POSITION A MATTER OF RECORD, I WOULD LIKE TO REVIEW THE FOLLOWING FACTS.

2. THE BASIC AUTHORIZATION FOR DISCLOSURE OF FULCRUM INFORMATION TO OUR PEOPLE CAN BE TRACED TO AN INITIAL MEETING ON THE SUBJECT WHICH TOOK PLACE AT LANGLEY AT WHICH MR MOORE, DR MCILLAN, DR FUDINI, DR AUGENSTEIN AND GENERAL MARTIN WERE PRESENT. THE MEETING WAS PRESIDED OVER BY MR MOORE. AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE MEETING, MR MOORE SPECIFICALLY REQUESTED THAT THE NRO STAFF, GENERAL GREEN, AND APPROPRIATE PERSONNEL OF GENERAL GREEN'S ORGANIZATION REVIEW THE PROPOSED FULCRUM SYSTEM. AT NO TIME DURING OR SUBSEQUENT TO THE MEETING, OR AS PART OF MR MOORE'S REQUEST, WAS ANY REFERENCE MADE TO THE FACT THAT THIS REVIEW WOULD REQUIRE A SPECIAL CODE NAME CLEARANCE.

3. AS A MATTER OF FACT, UNTIL THE RECEIPT OF THE ABOVE REFERENCE, SP WAS NOT AWARE THAT A DIRECTIVE EXISTED WHICH PLACED THE FULCRUM EFFORT FORMALLY INTO THE BYEMAN SYSTEM. SIMILARLY, WE HAVE NEVER RECEIVED ANY DIRECTION THAT ACCESS TO FULCRUM INFORMATION REQUIRED A SEPARATE CLEARANCE.

4. THESE FACTS, COUPLED WITH THE CONSIDERATION OF PREVIOUS DIRECTION FROM THE DIBO DESIGNED TO ELIMINATE CRITICISM RESULTING FROM THE PROLIFERATION OF CODE NAMES FOR STUDIES, APPLIED RESEARCH AND ADVANCED DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES, LED US TO THE MANNER IN WHICH WE HANDLED THE FULCRUM DATA. INCLUDED IN THE DIBO'S INSTRUCTIONS WITH REGARD TO STUDY WORK WAS THE CONCEPT THAT ADVANCED WORK WOULD NOT BE PLACED IN A CODE NAME STATUS UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THIS WORK WAS APPROVED AS A PROJECT UNDERTAKING.

5. WE, THEREFORE, HAVE TREATED FULCRUM DATA AS BYEMAN INFORMATION AND HAVE SO PROTECTED IT. ONLY PEOPLE POSSESSING BYEMAN CLEARANCES HAVE HAD ACCESS TO THESE DATA AND IT HAS BEEN AFFORDED THE SAME PROTECTION AS OUR R&D WORK DONE IN SUPPORT OF THE DEFINITION OF AN IMPROVED SEARCH SYSTEM. WE HAVE FUNDED COMPETITIVE STUDIES

ON THREE IMPROVED GENERAL SEARCH CAMERA SYSTEMS WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO MEET THE SAME GENERAL PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES AS THE FULCRUM STUDIES. FURTHER, WE HAVE CARRIED OUT FURNED RECOVERY SYSTEM DESIGN COMPETITION AND FURNED VEHICLE SYSTEM DESIGN COMPETITION COMPATIBLE WITH THESE CAMERA SYSTEM STUDIES. ALL OF THIS WORK HAS BEEN CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SYEMAN STANDARDS AND THE SYEMAN EQUIVALENT SPECIAL HANDLING PROCEDURES WHICH WE EMPLOY IN ALL OF OUR WORK. HOWEVER, NONE OF THESE HAVE BEEN PLACED UNDER SPECIAL, SEPARATE CODEWORD CLEARANCES.

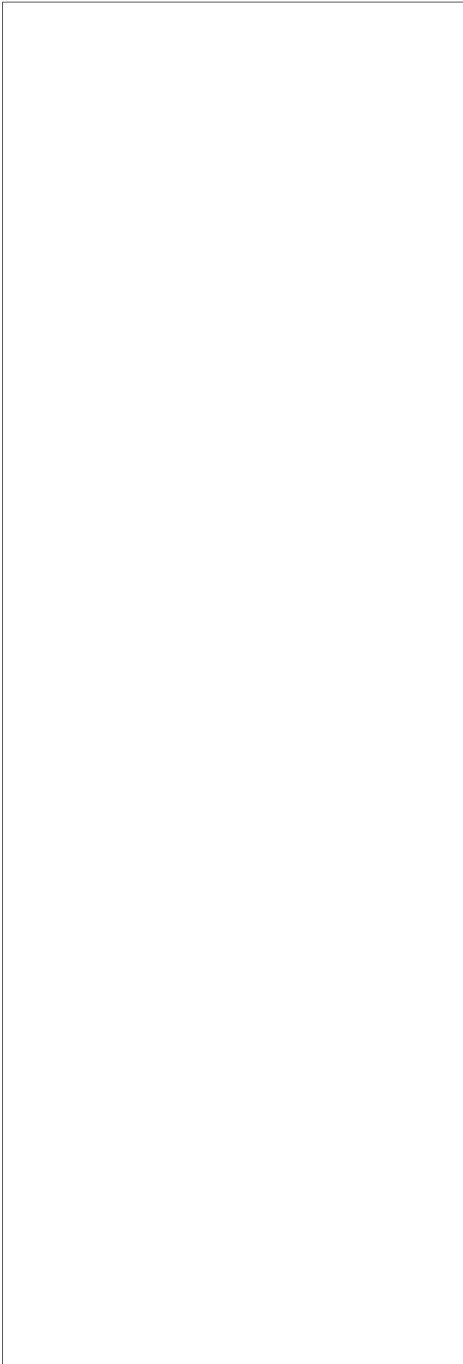
