SUBJECT: The 112-B Camera System

The 112-B Camera System has been developed by Program "B" of the S(NRO) to increase the collection capability of the 112-A. Both these systems are designed for use in a Lockheed U-2.

The primary difference between the two systems is that the ll2-B system has incorporated two cameras in a convergent mount, with a total convergence angle of 26°. The two cameras are similar to the single panoramic camera in the ll2-A.

Because the system will probably be flown over areas where the photography from such operations is classified SECRET, it was necessary to classify the inclosed camera data SECRET. The data have been carefully prepared to exclude information which might compromise factors relating to the covert procurement or prior usage of the camera.

It is most important that this data be released on a strict need-to-know basis, as determined by your office. All information
