Accordingly, I asked Dr. Flax for guidance on 8 July, and his reaction was that they had the right to ask questions and make recommendations (a more liberal interpretation than mine—I feel that their responsibility should be limited to the 100th SRW cost coverage).

I have passed Dr. Flax' reaction on to Colone and and the will tell the review committee to send their questions to Dr. Flax over General Carroll's signature. These may come in before I return from leave, so I told Dr. Flax I'd slort you and Frank Bartley.

I still feel that the answers should be like "Deputy Secretary Mitse, DCI Helms, and Mr. Hornig, as an Executive Committee, approved the U-2R Procurement. Secretary MoMemora approved the aircraft allocation, based on a recommendation from Mr. Helms. Their basis for approval was to maintain a viable U-2 program. Funding is within the MRP program." etc.—generalities, rather than specifics, with enough to indicate the high level of consideration and approval. It may be that if they have to get General Carroll's signature, the questions will go away, or be limited to 100th SBW cost coverage.

The recent PCR for the 100th SRN goofed on the U-2 portion, in that no attrition was forecast thru FI 1974, and some FI 1970 and subsequent year increases were questionable. Rather than re-do the PCR, it was submitted as is, with qualifying footnotes, and Dr. Flax said he put qualifying remarks in a transmittel memo. CSD could be critical in this connection.
