Dear Bob,

In reference to your letter of January 14, 1971, (BYE 65500/71), I am attaching a letter of appointment for Captain R. K. Geiger as Director of NRO Program C. I believe the choice of Captain Geiger to be a good one.

The expanded role of Program C can be of significant benefit to the National Reconnaissance Program. I recognize that there are growing pains associated with the creation of any new office such as PM-16 is now experiencing. I am particularly concerned with the covert security aspects of Program C. During the period of organization and staffing, we both need to be assured that adequate resources are available to Captain Geiger. In this regard, I have tasked the NRO Staff to cooperate fully and consult with Captain Geiger in all matters of mutual concern.

I believe it would be well for you and me to meet at regular intervals over the next few months to assess Captain Geiger's progress and to determine the extent to which it is appropriate for Program C to assume an expanded role in the NRP. I would envision a Memorandum of Understanding resulting from these meetings, where we would further delineate Captain Geiger's functions and
