I received the following information from Col Sparman at the Cape as of 1800, 7 Dec 71

1. Surface vessels will leave at 0400, 8 Dec, for the search area carrying sonar and recovery gear.
2. The FV3 aircraft will arrive 0700, 8 Dec, at the Cape. It will map the ocean area with magnetic detection gear to help locate debris under water.

CINCLANT is checking on the availability of a mine sweeper which may be put into service on 9 or 10 December, if needed.

Lots of parts are washing up on the shore at low tide. Foot patrols and vehicles are searching for and picking up these parts.
