

MEMORANDUM FOR CAPTAIN GEIGER

SUBJECT: Briefing for General Advisory Committee on Arms Control and Disarmement

Sir:

I attach a copy of Mr. McCloy's letter to Mr. Packard which asks for an NRO contribution to the GAC's understanding of intelligence sources as they relate to SALT. I am also including a copy of Colonel Furlong's memo in which he states that Mr. Packard would like to be informed of the content of the NRO presentation before it is delivered.

As we discussed yesterday, the specific questions that the GAC would like us to address lie generally within your functional area. I understand, therefore, th^{Del} will prepare the briefing that Dr. Naka will present. We will, of course, be glad to assist in any way we can and in any event would like an opportunity to review the proposed briefing.

At Dr. Naka's suggestion, Mr. Fina, Staff Director of the GAC, has agreed to reverse the sequence of the NSA and NRO briefings, thus providing a more logical development of the overall presentation. Mr. Fina also has indicated that Mr. McCloy has invited Admiral Anderson, newly appointed Chairman of the PFIAB, to join the GAC on May 28. Additionally, Dr. Kissinger desires to speak to the Committee and tentatively will do so around 12:00 Noon. Mr. Fina has further advised that Mr. Risley, Technical Advisor to the GAC, will contact
