SUBJECT: "Fact Of" Paper

I met this afternoon with Captain Jennings of State Department, Bureau of Intelligence and Research to discuss the outline of the "fact of" paper. Mr. Katz from the Arms Control Agency was in attendance as well as a "consultant" brought in by the State Department ostensibly to write a paper. I presented the attached outline as a firm DOD position of the issue and made the point clear that DOD strongly believes that there is no gain to be made by acknowledging the "fact of." Any paper resulting from this tasking should relate to the issues brought up in our outline. I further expressed the feeling that it appeared unnecessary to have a private consultant write such a paper. I also relayed General Allen's specific comments made to me about the "fact of" issue following his review of the outline. Captain Jennings said that he would have to touch base with Mr. Hitchcock who is ill today and Mr. Hyland, the Director of the Bureau.
