

SUBJECT: FY 74-FY 75 Funding

The following is an update on the current situation regarding potential NRP funding cuts for FY 74 and FY 75.

As you know the House Appropriations Committee recommended in FY 74 and FY 74 are reduction to the SDS program.


Additionally there were recommendations for reductions of flion which was to fund the CES package and an additional formulation of RDT&E.

After discussions with the IC Staff, I agreed that John Clark would have the initial contact with the Senate Appropriations Committee Staff. If additional information was required or if the Committee desired direct contact, these requests would be passed to the NRO Comptroller or the DNRO. With this minor modification, we can live with the reduction and still stay within the November ExCom decisions.

Also on Friday, Dr. LaBerge and Dr. Currie discussed potential RDT&E cuts in FY 75. They suggested an approximate 10 percent cut to our Special Activities account. This is shown on page 4 of TAB A. It amounts to a proposed reduction of and leaves us with a revised program of



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Coincidentally, within terms of the November ErCom decision, the NRP requirement for PDTCF funds is Added to this should be for U-2 countermeasures which is currently not programmed for FY 75 in either the Air Force or the NRP. The total of the NRP and the U-2 requirements is ore than the suggested revised program. In contact with the people in the Assistant Secretary's office and this difference should be worked out.

In this particular instance the fact that the resulting available funds and requirements came out almost the same, was accidental but also very fortunate. I will continue to keep you informed of new developments.
