
SUBJECT: NRO National Imagery Plan for Satellites


Imaging Program.

SUBJECT: NRO National Imaging Plan for Satellites

Last week we discussed my development of the National Imaging Plan for Satellites (NIPS) which I intend to integrate eventually with the SIGINT plan in order to define the total thrust of the NRP in the 1980's.

As a result of our discussions I am proceeding with the first phase of the NIPS. This phase builds upon current NRO projects and programs and is directed primarily at building an adequate base upon which potential system capabilities for the 1980's can be defined. A time phased plan is being developed identifying actions required in the R&D or operations areas. Basic decision points necessary to reach specific objectives considering the technical, economic, and operational feasibility will also be identified.

Upon completion of the first phase I will sponsor a detailed intelligence community evaluation of those alternatives found to be feasible for the 1980's. This will give each element of the community an opportunity to express views on the potential of various alternatives as well as to provide a positive feedback for out year NRP resource allocation decisions.

I will provide you with a progress report on elements of the first phase of the NIPS in September.
